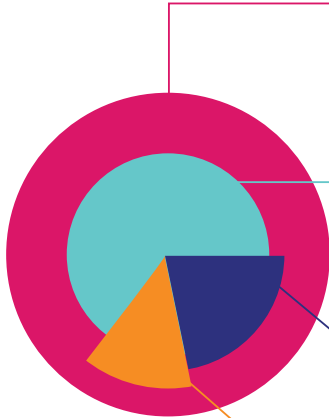

Education

- Nursing Scholarships in cardiac care, midwifery, haematology and cancer services are enabling our next generation of healthcare professionals.
- Patient navigators are assisting our cancer patients and their families to navigate their treatment journey and coordination of care.
- Our Clinical Education Centre (CEC) is providing access for our nursing and medical students, to cutting edge simulation technology.



Research and Technology

- The implementation of our Clinical Trials Unit (CTU) data base is playing a vital role in assisting trial coordination and business reporting.
- The expansion of our ICIMS System is enhancing data collation for registries, research, and integration with hospital systems.
- Dementia research focussing on the role of diversional therapy initiatives on patient outcomes - has been made possible by a research grant.
- Continual research efforts driven by our Research Office, Clinical Trials Unit, Australasian Research Institute and research grants.



Facilities / Equipment / Services

- Our purpose-built Integrated Cancer Centre (ICC) is providing the gold-standard in cancer diagnosis, treatment and management.
- We have expanded our range of free Cancer Support Services to include counselling, reflexology, yoga, meditation, wig library, support groups, nutrition workshops and oncology massage.
- Ongoing upgrades to Jacaranda Lodge continue to enhance the rural visitor experience.
- Purpose designed patient Navigator consulting rooms are enabling the highest level of personal care for our cancer patients.
- The Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) room is facilitating discussions on patient treatments across disciplines.
- A new Heart Lung Machine is supporting patients in critical situations like emergency surgery or prolonged illness.
- Specialised triage treatment chairs in Emergency Care have expedited treatment while awaiting a bed.
- Upgrades of our Cardiac Catheter Labs (CCL) to integrate the latest ultrasound and technology.
- Coronary Care Unit (CCU) treatment chairs are promoting patient comfort and mobility.

Your gifts

Making or changing your Will to include a gift to San Foundation can be as simple as contacting your solicitor who will ensure your wishes are captured correctly in a legally binding manner.

You may like to begin by considering where you would like your gift to go. For example:

- Area of most need.
- A specific area of the hospital that is important to you eg. Research, Technology, Education or Facilities.
- A specific area of interest eg. Neurosciences, Cancer, Heart, Orthopaedics or Maternity.

Types of Gifts

There are many ways to make an incredible and lasting contribution through your legacy

RESIDUAL GIFT

The remainder of your estate after all gifts of money and specific items have been distributed.

PERCENTAGE GIFT

A percentage of your whole estate or a percentage of the residuary once gifts and other costs have been deducted.

PECUNIARY GIFT

A gift of a specific sum of money.

A SPECIFIC ASSET

A specific piece of real estate or shares.



Correct Wording

FOR GIFTS IN WILLS

It's important that San Foundation is correctly named in your Will to ensure your wishes can be met. You may give this wording to your solicitor when preparing your Will.

**"I give to San Foundation,
ABN 53 320 740 321.**

- **The residue of my estate (or _ % of the residue of my estate) or**
- **The whole of my estate (or _% of my estate)**
- **The sum of \$ _**
- **A specific asset or assets, such as shares or property**

Free of all duties and taxes, for which the receipt of the authorised officer shall be an absolute discharge."
